

# Mentoring: A Legacy of Encouragement

Women long for connection and meaning. Where do today's women turn for friendship, advice, role models? Facebook? Google? Scripture makes it clear that God desires women in the church to connect in real live mentoring relationships.

Basing our study on Titus 2:3-5, we'll examine the relevance of this kind of relationship today, the biblical qualifications of a mentor, and how God expects us to grow through mentoring relationships.

# You Will Know Them By Their Love - An Historical and Practical Examination of True Christian Hospitality - Kathy Scarbrough/Cindy Gregson

Recovering a Biblical Understanding of Hospitality - Session I Hospitality as exemplified and defined in the Scriptures is a command to all God's people toward believer and non-believer alike. We will examine key Biblical passages and stories to help define exactly what true hospitality should be in attitude and deed and how, when done properly, God uses it to promote covenant within the church and evangelize the unbeliever in our community.

#### The Practice of Christian Hospitality - Session II

A practical discussion on acts of hospitality, with Q & A session. Topics covered will include preparing for guests - expected and unexpected, engaging a technologically consumed culture that is 'too busy,' and receiving hospitality.

# Women: God's Instruments for Noble Purposes -Olivia Durham

In order to function happily as women in the church (married, single, or widowed) we need to study the owner's manual. What do we have in common as women created to love God and glorify and enjoy him forever? How do our individual gifts fit into the needs of the church and the Great Commission? Come prepared to participate and discuss in this two part workshop:

Session I - Lead On! Recognizing that the OPC does not ordain women to church office, how best may women use their life experiences, providential talents, and spiritual gifts within the church for the glory of God?

Session II - A Spiritual Goldmine: A survey of refreshingly counter cultural examples of women theologians and fellow laborers for the kingdom, throughout the Scripture and some modern day examples as well.

# Leadership Wives: The Conflict Challenge - Dawna Selle

When there is conflict in the church, how do I best glorify God? How can I be an agent of peace when there is confusion and misunderstanding? In this workshop we will investigate the unique challenges, responsibilities, opportunities and responses to strife available to faithful elders' wives, leading to encouragement of the body of Christ during trying times.

#### Workshops Continued -

#### Being a Titus 2 Woman - Jan van der Jagt

This workshop offers a practical follow-up to the conference theme, "Generation to Generation", concentrating particularly on Titus 2:3-5. Using an interactive format, we will explore (1) what Biblical qualities define a woman who is to mentor other women, and (2) how she is to execute her responsibilities - whom she is to encourage, what she is to teach, and how she is to disciple.

#### YOUNG WOMEN'S SESSIONS - Hidden Art

Keeping with the theme of this year's retreat, "Generation to Generation", the Young Women's Sessions will be using Edith Schaeffer's book, "The Hidden Art of Homemaking" for discussion times, facilitated by Arden Detweiler. "Hidden Art" is not so much a book about learning to cook, sew and clean although they are each in and of themselves becoming a "lost art", but rather, it is about encouraging us to create "home" where we are and in whatever stage of life we are in. Whether a teenager within a family, life in a dorm, a young single, a mother, sister or a grandmother, this book discusses how to bless others within your sphere of influence with the concept of creating an inviting space in order to minister and be ministered to.

Each teen who comes to the retreat will receive a copy of Edith Schaeffer's book. We will be attending "A Biblical Understanding Of Hospitality" workshop on Friday and "The Practice Of Christian Hospitality" workshop on Saturday taught by Kathy Scarbrough and Cindy Gregson. There will be discussion regarding Schaeffer's book when we are together in our cabin as well as participating in some creative things a la' Edith Schaeffer together. It should be an eye-opening time for all.
