

# Orthodox Presbyterian Shiloh Institute

June 17-19, 2025

Report of the Director

October 7, 2025

## **Purpose**

OPSI is designed to introduce prospective ministers to the work of the Orthodox Presbyterian Church as a means of recruiting able young men for OPC ministry and future participation in MTIOPC. This is similar to the Timothy Conference, but with an older age group in view (last year college; first two years seminary).

To fulfill this purpose the following themes were taught and discussed at length:

- The OPC: continuity with Reformed tradition and distinguishing characteristics.
- The centrality, nature, and benefits of being a confessional church.
- The importance of the means of grace in the church's mission.
- The meaning of a culturally-aware pilgrim church.
- The work of a minister of the Word in an organized church and a mission work.

## **Participants and Location**

The 2024 institute having been canceled due to a lack of applications six students were accepted for the 2025 institute. Three came from Westminster Seminary in California, one from Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary, one from Greenville Presbyterian Theological Seminary, and one from Grove City College.

Instructors and students arrived on Tuesday, June 17. Our location in the White Mountains makes travel arrangements a lot simpler, due to the proximity of Manchester Boston Regional and Logan airports. Thanks to student Matt Breault for help with transportation and hospitality in Manchester for the California men.

This was our twelfth annual institute and our eleventh year at Camp Shiloh in Jefferson, New Hampshire, overlooking the White Mountains. The main lodge is very suitable for lectures and discussions, and at a very reasonable cost. This venue would easily accommodate a dozen or more students. Retreat director Greg Gordon is a delightful and accommodating host who shares our commitment to the Reformed faith.

## Instruction

Each of the four instructors gave a two-hour talk interspersed with discussion and then two separate two hour periods to discuss pre-assigned readings.

Darryl Hart taught “The OPC and Global Calvinism”

John Muether taught “The Reformed Faith and Its Modern Substitutes”

Stephen Tracey taught “The View of an OPC Immigrant”

Greg Reynolds taught “The Shape of OPC Ministry”

John Muether and Darryl Hart led a discussion of sociologist Christian Smith’s new book *Why Religion Went Obsolete*

A fair amount of free time, as well as leisurely meals, allowed plenty of opportunity for informal discussion among participants and instructors.

As in the past we allotted time before departure to help Greg Gordon with various tasks around the camp. This year it was piling wood in Greg’s large (18 cords or more) wood lot.

## 2025 Assessment

Having completed its twelfth year, the positive feedback from students continues to indicate that the Institute is achieving its stated purpose. The Shiloh institute continues to feed students into the OPC internship program.

We now have a data base for all students who have attended OPSI since its inception in 2010. We have had eighty-four students thus far. Fifteen of those students are currently ministerial members of the OPC. Several others are pursuing ordination and three are on the verge of ordination (after completion of internships).

The variety of seminaries and colleges represented continued to enhance the atmosphere of the Institute and the interaction among students. We also had a college student about to enter seminary. The seminaries from which the sixty-two students have come are: Bethlehem Seminary, Calvin Theological Seminary, Covenant Theological Seminary, Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary-Hamilton, GCTS-Jacksonville, Greenville Presbyterian Theological Seminary, Mid-America Reformed Seminary, North American Seminary, Reformed Presbyterian Theological Seminary, Reformed Theological Seminary-Dallas, RTS-Jackson, RTS-Orlando, Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary, Westminster Seminary California, and Westminster Theological Seminary.

## Next Year

The next Shiloh Institute is scheduled for June 16–18, 2026.
